**The Last Decade of Western**

Kahn and Dunlop were both former employees of AT&T and had been instrumental in the development of the ARPANET, the precursor to the Internet. Kahn and Dunlop were both also former employees of Western Union and had been instrumental in the development of the Telex network. MCI was founded in 1980 and was initially a subsidiary of Western Union. In 1981, MCI was spun off as an independent company. In 1982, MCI was listed on the New York Stock Exchange.
