ByLaws

We, the undersigned, wishing to secure for ourselves the pleasures and benefits of an association of persons commonly interested in Amateur Radio, constitute ourselves as the Calaveras Amateur Radio Society, Incorporated (CARS, Inc.) herein referred to as the Club, and enact these Bylaws as our governing laws. It shall be our purpose to further the exchange of information and cooperation between members, to promote radio knowledge, fraternalism, individual operating efficiency, scientific and technical advancement of the state-of-the-art, and to so conduct Club programs and activities for the advancement of the general interest and welfare of Amateur Radio in the community.

ARTICLE I

OFFICES

 Sec. 1 Principal Office.

The Principal office of the Corporation is located at 1766 Patricia Lane, PO Box 2602, Arnold, CA 94112.

Sec. 2 Change of Address.

The Officers are hereby granted full power and authority to change the location of the principal office of the Club. Any such change shall be noted by the Secretary in these Bylaws; alternatively, this Section may be amended to state the new location.

ARTICLE II

MEMBERSHIP

Membership shall be by written application, and upon such terms as the Club provides in Article VII of its By-Laws.

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

Sec. 1 This Club shall have five (5) Officers: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Public Information Officer (PIO). Officers shall serve without compensation.

- Sec. 2 Each Officer of this Club shall be elected for a term of two (2) years by ballot of eligible Club members, as follows:
 - a) The President, Public Information Officer, and Secretary shall be elected in odd years to serve the following even/odd year terms.
 - b) The Vice President and Treasurer shall be elected in even years to serve for the following odd/even year terms.
- Sec. 3 The duties of Officers shall be as defined in the Bylaws of the Club.
- Sec. 4 The Officers shall fill vacancies occurring between elections with appointees with approval of the attending Club membership at the next meeting.
- Sec. 5 Officers may be removed by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the voting membership.
- Sec. 6 Officer elections shall be held in October, with balloting ending on November 15th. Elected Officers shall be announced in December and take office at the December Quarterly meeting. Nominations (slate) shall be presented at the September Quarterly Club meeting.
- Sec. 7 The Number of Officers shall be defined in the Bylaws of the Club.
- Sec. 8 Officers are responsible for the Club Operation, and shall cause to happen any action required of a California Corporation by state, or federal law.

ARTICLE IV

MEETINGS

The Bylaws of the Club shall provide for regular and special meetings.

ARTICLE V

AMENDMENTS

- Sec. 1 Proposals for amendments to the Bylaws shall be submitted in writing at a meeting of the Club, and shall be discussed at a Club meeting.
- Sec. 2 Action to amend the Bylaws shall be by ballot. A ballot shall be sent to every eligible voting member. This ballot may be delivered by mail, personally, or conveyed by other means of written or electronic communication. This ballot shall provide an opportunity for each eligible member to give approval or disapproval of each proposal being set forth in the ballot.
- Sec. 3 These Bylaws may be amended by two-thirds of the eligible voting Club membership.

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120 121	MEMBERSHIP
122 123	Full membership in the Club is open to all licensed Amateur Radio Operators.
124 125 126 127 128 129	As a member of the Club, your dues help support a variety of Club activities. Your membership funds provide maintenance fees for the Club's repeater, and equipment. Funds are also used to support the Club's portable communications equipment, and for printing and mailing the Club newsletter. In addition, your dues help the Club provide emergency service training (EOC/OES), education, testing for licenses, license upgrading, social events, and community services.
130 131 132	Membership Dues are payable prior to June 30, of each calendar year.
133 134	Annual Membership shall run from July to June of following calendar year.
135 136	DUES
137 138 139 140	The Club, by a majority vote of the Officers and voting members, may levy on the membership such dues or assessments as deemed necessary for the business of the Club. Non-payment of such dues or assessments shall be cause for expulsion from the Club, and shall be within the discretion of the Officers.

145 146 147	Sec. 1 FULL MEMBER
148 149 150 151	Open to the legal holder of an Amateur radio license granted under Part 97 of the rules and regulations of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC).
152 153 154 155 156 157	Full membership includes all Club privileges, as well as the right to hold a Club office and to vote for Club Officers. Applications for membership shall be accompanied by dues and presented to the treasurer at a regular meeting or by mail to the Club address at PO Box 391, Angels Camp, CA 95222.
158	Sec. 2 ASSOCIATE MEMBER
159 160 161 162	Open to those actively engaged in a class leading to an Amateur Radio License, and all interested persons. Includes all Club privileges except the right to hold office and voting privileges.

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Sec. 3 **STUDENT MEMBER**

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This membership category shall be open to licensed or non-licensed full or part-time students. Student members shall not be eliqible to seek any office in this Club, nor have any voting privileges. Otherwise, Student members will have all privileges and responsibilities of a membership. Annual Student dues shall be set at 25 percent of Full membership dues.

Sec. 4 **NEW AMATEURS**

Any Individual obtaining a NEW amateur radio license, as a result of testing at a CARS sponsored "VE" test session, shall be granted free membership in CARS until the start of the next membership period.

NOTE: This provision DOES NOT pertain to Upgrades or Vanity Calls.

Sec. 5 HONORARY AND LIFETIME MEMBERS

Honorary or Lifetime Members may be conferred as such by a vote of the Club membership.

"Honorary" members are individuals given special recognition by the Club members for promoting the advancement of the Club and amateur radio in the community. Honorary members may attend meetings, but may not vote.

"Lifetime" members shall have all the privileges and responsibilities of Full Club membership without paying annual dues.

ARTICLE VIII

INDEMNIFICATION OF OFFICERS AND MEMBERS

Indemnification (to hold harmless) is an agreement between two parties not to hold one of the parties responsible for future legal action or fines, and usually only works in one direction.

For example, you as a renter of a chainsaw agree not to hold the "Rental Company" employees responsible if you have an accident with their chainsaw. Indemnification clauses usually trump any other legal arguments, so it is important for both parties to understand precisely what actions are covered under an Indemnification Agreement.

Sec. 1 Right of Indemnity

To the fullest extent permitted by law, this Club shall indemnify its Officers, employees, members, and other persons described in Section 7237 of the California Corporations Code ("CCC"), or any successor statute, including persons formerly occupying any such position, against all expenses, judgments, fines, settlements and other amounts actually and reasonably incurred by them in connection with any "proceeding," as that term is used in that Section, and including an action by or in the right of the Club, by reason of the fact that the person is or was a person described in that section.

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"Expenses" as used in this Bylaw shall have the same meaning as in Section 7237 of the CCC, or any successor statute.

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Sec. 2 Approval of Indemnity

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On written request to the Officers of the Club by any person seeking indemnification under Section 7237(b) or Section 7237(c) of the CCC, or any successor statute, the Officers shall promptly determine under Section 7237(e) of the CCC whether the applicable standard of conduct set forth in Section 7237(b) or Section 7237(c) has been met and, if so, the Officers shall submit the request to a review and vote of the Club Indemnity Committee for authorization of the indemnification.

Sec. 3 Indemnity Committee

The President shall have the authority to establish an Indemnity Committee by appointment. The Indemnity Committee shall be selected from three (3) eligible voting Club members, and two (2) current Officers of the Club. The President, or his designee, shall be the presiding chairman of this committee. The committee shall review all requests for Indemnity, and shall decide if the request(s) will be accepted or denied on a case by case basis. Written notice of the committee's review and decision will be provided to the requestor (s) for Indemnity within ten (10) days of the committees decision, and be recorded by the Secretary.

Sec. 4 Insurance

The Corporation shall purchase and maintain insurance to the full extent permitted by law on behalf of its Officers, employees, and other agents, to cover any liability asserted against or incurred by any Officer, member, or agent in such capacity arising from the Officer's, employee's, or agent's status as such. This insurance shall provide coverage against all lawsuits resulting from bodily injury and property damage at ARRL Affiliated Club sponsored activities. This coverage will include field day events, concessions stands, dances, banquets, parties, auctions, raffles, picnics and meetings, and will apply to official Club participation in any community sponsored events. This coverage shall include for the payment of court and legal costs of defense for covered items.

The insurance shall provide for the reimbursement for first aid to others at the time of an accident. An owner of a premises used or rented by the Club may also be named as an additional insured.

The ARRL Club Liability Insurance provides up to one (1) million (\$1,000,000) in coverage for each occurrence, and up to two (2) million in aggregate coverage each year at a reasonable premium.

Coverage shall be provided for, but will not limited to the following lawsuits:

- a) Bodily injury as a result of Club activities
- b) Damage to property of others resulting from Club activities
- c) Personal injury and advertising injury, including libel, slander, defamation of character, false arrest, invasion of privacy,
- d) Those resulting from the sale of foods, beverages or other products

- e) When serving or providing alcoholic beverages at functions incidental to the Club.
- f) Real or alleged faults in work completed by the Club, which result in bodily injury or property damage
- g) Involving the use of automobiles not owned by the Club, but used for official Club activities.
- h) Those arising from injury caused by the rendering or failure to render healthcare services by non-professionals
- i) Those arising from fire damage (up to \$100,000) to premises not owned by the Club, but used for a Club sponsored activity
- j) The defense against all such lawsuits, even though the charges are groundless, false or fraudulent.

ARTICLE IX

DUTIES of OFFICERS

President

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Club and conduct them according to the rules adopted. The President shall enforce due observance of the constitution and By-Laws; decide all questions of order; sign all official documents adopted by the Club and perform all other duties pertaining to the Office of the President.

Vice President

The Vice President shall assume all the duties of the President in his or her absence. The Vice President shall organize Club activities, plan and recommend contests for operating benefits, advance Club interests and activities, as approved by the Club. The Vice President shall maintain close liaison with the section Emergency Coordinator to further Club participation in Amateur Radio Public Service.

Secretary

The Secretary shall keep a record of the proceedings of all meetings, keep a roll of members, submit membership applications, conduct all Club correspondence, and read communications at each business meeting. The Secretary shall note all amendments, changes, and additions on the Constitution and Bylaws, and permit those documents to be reviewed by members upon request.

Treasurer

The Treasurer shall receive and receipt for all monies paid to the Club, keep an accurate account of all monies received and expended, pay no bills in excess of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) without authorization by a majority of the Officers. At the end of each quarter, the Treasurer shall submit an itemized statement of disbursements and receipts to the Officers. The Treasurer shall provide for all quarterly and annual financial statements and documents required by the State and Federal Governments to maintain its nonprofit status.

Public Information Officer

The Public Information Officer (PIO) shall be the Club information focal point, and be responsible for interfacing with the media (newspapers, radio, television, etc.), providing Club news releases, publishing the Club newsletter, and providing for the better welfare of the Club through dissemination of information to the public.

All Officers

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 All Officers of the Club shall turn over all Club materials/items to their respective successors.

ARTICLE X

MEETINGS

Regular Club meetings shall be held each quarter at a place and time as determined by the Officers. Notification of all Club meetings shall be delivered to all Club members in person, by U.S. mail, email, fax, or conveyed by other means of written or electronic communication at least seventy-two (72) hours prior to any such meeting.

The President upon written request of Three (3) Club members, shall call special meetings. Notice of such meetings shall be given to the Officers and members at least seventy-two (72) hours prior to any such meeting, and shall provide information concerning the business to be transacted. It shall be the responsibility of the Officers to call special meetings of the Club membership.

ARTICLE XI

COMMITTEES

The Club may create one or more committees. Appointments to committees of the Club shall be by majority vote of members present. Any such committee shall have the authority granted to it by the Club, to the extent provided in the resolution, except that no committee shall:

- a) Fill vacancies of Officers or any committee
- b) Fix compensation of the Officers for serving
- c) Amend or repeal Bylaws or adopt new Bylaws
- d) Amend or repeal any resolution of the Club that by its express terms is not so amendable or repealable
- e) Create any other committees of the Club, or appoint members of committees
- f) Approve any contract or transaction to which the (Club) is a party and in which one or more of its Officers has a material financial interest.

ARTICLE XII PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY All meetings shall be conducted in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order, Revised, except when they conflict with these Bylaws, or with the laws of the State of California.
