Minutes for Quarterly General Meeting, July 10th, 2023, 18:30 Meeting Location: Round Table Pizza, Angels Camp, CA

1) Meeting called to order

- a) Welcome by club president, Steve, W6RXK
- b) Pledge of allegiance led by Mark, N6IV
- c) Self-introductions by all, including returning members Larry, W6LA, and Mike, K6AAN, and new member Kristen, KD6SUN.

Reading of Minutes by Jack, W6JAK. Mike, WA6ZTY, noted that the radio on loan at Summit is an FT-1500, not FT-150. The minutes were approved with the correction.

2) Treasurer's Report by Ken, AE6LA (see attached reports).

- a) The club have checking account and cash assets totaling \$6,780.73 with no liabilities.
- b) Ken provided a comparison of expenses over the last five years. Equipment sales have made a significant contribution to the club's finances.
- c) The fiscal year is July 1st through June 30th. Ken will be reviewing and completing the EoY submissions to the Franchise Tax Board and Secretary of State to maintain the club's non-profit corporation status.
- d) Thirty of the 89 club members have not paid their yearly dues.
- e) Knox La Rue sent a bill for \$900 for the Fowler repeater site rent. Steve negotiated with Knox and got it reduced to \$500 since the new tower has not been installed. Knox reiterated that the club will have a good spot on the new tower for our antenna.
- f) Pacific Trail Runs donated \$850 cash for the club's support to the Arnold Rim Trail Run. This donation replaced the previous donation of \$500 by check, which bouned.

3) Repeater Report presented by Ken, AE6LA.

- a) Fowler Peak Repeater: The APRS radio continues to be off the air due to its antenna being used for the repeater.
- b) Summit Level Repeater: The APRS at Summit is functioning very well with very broad coverage. Al, KI6OBM, donated a Yaesu FT-8900R to replace the Yaesu FT-1500 on loan from Mike, WA6ZTY. Mike commented that the site is running on 16 golf cart batteries which will be replaced by lithium batteries.
- c) Reba Repeater: The Reba repeater is not being used very much, and the APRS antenna is being used at Summit to keep APRS operational for the county.

4) Monday Night Net Report by Mark, N6IV.

- a) The average number of member of check-ins for the past two months was 28 with a range of 27 to 32.
- b) Guest check-ins averaged 9, with a range of 6 to 11.

5) Breakfast Report presented by Dee, KM6ELF.
