## **Calaveras Amateur Radio Society (CARS)**

## Minutes for Quarterly General Meeting, March 14th, 2024, 18:30 Meeting Location: Round Table Pizza, Angels Camp, CA

### 1) Meeting called to order:

- a) Welcome by club president, Steve, W6RXK;
- b) Pledge of allegiance led by Mark, N6IV;
- c) Self-introductions by all including a visitor from Angels Camp, Doug, N6BU.
- 2) Presentation on GMRS by Ron Trout, KK6QPP: Ron provided and overview of GMRS usage in Tuolumne county and how it is being adopted for emergency communications by local community groups. There are several GMRS repeaters in Tuolumne county and Ken, AE6LA, is working with a community group in Arnold on the installation of a repeater in that area. Amateur radio operators are providing technical and operational expertise and are leading the efforts to establish GMRS as a communications resource available to non-licensed members of the community for use in public service and emergencies. Information on the Tuolumne county and Arnold GMRS groups is available on Facebook, and Ron maintains the calaverasgmrs.com website.
- **3) Reading of Minutes by Jack, W6JAK.** Chuck, W6AJW, motioned that the minutes be approved as read. The motion was seconded and passed.
- 4) Treasurer's Report by Ken, AE6LA (see attached report):
  - a) Membership dues are due June 30th;
  - b) There was a net loss of \$83.67 for the last reporting period with total income of \$240.64 and expenses of \$324.31. The largest expense was liability insurance with a \$200.00 premium.
- 5) Monday Night Net Report by Mark, N6IV.
  - a) The average number of member of check-ins for the past two months was 35 with a range of 27 to 42. Forty-four percent of the club checked-in;
  - b) Guest check-ins averaged 7, with a range of 3 to 10;
  - c) The January 1<sup>st</sup> net had light attendance.

### 6) Repeater Report presented by Ken, AE6LA.

- a) Fowler repeater: The vaults were open at the site. Ken will check out the situation. Knox LaRue is planning to install the repeater antenna next week. Interference on the repeater has been caused by two sources: 1) by the push-up mast rubbing against the Connex during windy conditions and 2) by an Echolink station in Rancho Cordova identifying on the repeater frequency. Ken sent an email to the Echolink station owner who subsequently took the station off the repeater frequency.
- b) Andy, NV6V, is working on an All-Star node at Fowler. It is turned on and connected to the Internet, but is not connected to the repeater. The plan is to connect the node to a hub in the cloud for extra security. This allows the node to be disabled remotely. The next step is to connect the node to the repeater controller.
- c) Summit Level repeater: the system is working well. Ken and Mke, WB6ZTY, were at the site a couple of weeks ago.
- d) The Reba repeater is still on the air. Ken tried interfacing the TM-V71a with a controller and

found it will work. Ken will order a new controller and install it with the TM-V71a.

- **7)** Breakfast Report presented by Lynn, AC6CY (Dee, KM6ELF, was not at the breakfast). Eight people attended the breakfast on March 2<sup>nd</sup> at the Murphys Hotel.
- 8) Web Master's Report presented by Andy, NV6V. Mike, KB6USJ, continues to keep the site up to date. Of note was information on the site about the passing of Bob Heil, K9EID.
- 9) Public Information Officer Report. Presented by Mike, KB6USJ:
  - a) The Ride and Walk for Art event is taking place this coming Sunday;
  - b) There are lots of contests and QSO parties, including a special event station for the 105<sup>th</sup> birthday of the American Legion.
- **10) ARES/RACES Report.** A report provided by Sam, WS6P, was presented by Jack, W6JAK (see attached).

### 11) New Business.

- a) Information on Directors and Officers (D&O) liability insurance was presented by Jack, W6JAK, to determine if such insurance coverage is needed for the club in addition to the general liability coverage it currently maintains (see attached for comparison of D&O to general liability insurance). Given the minimal liability exposure to the club's officers from ham radio activities and also having no employees (the source of up to 95% of D&O claims), minimal financial transactions, and not owning facilities, it was concluded that D&O insurance was not needed;
- b) An email address for the club was discussed. Currently the club's website does not show an email address for queries from the general public. Mark, N6IV, motioned to add a reflector address to the site which will forward messages to the PIO. The motion was seconded and approved. Andy, NV6V, will check into adding a reflector address to the club's contact information.

### 12) Old Business.

- a) Al, KF6OBM, has spent a couple of hours working on the club's trailer. He would like to have the trailer transferred to his property to make working on it more convenient. Chuck, W6AJW, motioned to authorize purchase of new tires to make relocation of the trailer possible. The motion was seconded and approved;
- b) Discussion on the update to the club's bylaws is deferred to the next business meeting.
- **13)** Round Table: Mike, WB6ZTY, has used radio equipment for sale, including to VHF yagis.
- 14) Happenings: In addition to the list of happenings in the agenda, the following were discussed:
  - a) Steve, W6RXK, has asked the Vine and Branch church if the club could use their facility again for the club picnic in September. He has not heard back from them;
  - b) The Death Ride is scheduled for July 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup>.
- **15) Adjournment.** Lynn, AC6CY motioned adjournment of the meeting which was approved at 2008 hours.

#### General Liability and Directors & Officers Liability — Differences and Similarities

Differences

General Liability

Covers Bodily Injury and Property

Covers accidents only. Claims usually arise directly from operations rather than governance.

Usually Occurrence Liability Standardized policy wording.

#### Similarities

General Liability

Covers liabilities common to all nonprofits. Provides broad catch-all coverage. Other liability coverages are more specific and narrower in scope.

Includes all board members, employees and volunteers as Insureds.

#### Directors & Officers Liability

Always excludes Bodily Injury and Property Covers Wrongful Acts. Claims usually arise from governance or management decisions. Board members, management staff and the organization itself are likely to be defendants. Usually Claims-Made Liability. Non-standard policy wording.
