## **Calaveras Amateur Radio Society (CARS)**

## Minutes for Quarterly General Meeting, Jan. 9th, 2025, 18:30 Meeting Location: Round Table Pizza, Angels Camp, CA

### 1) Meeting called to order:

- a) Welcome by club president, Steve, W6RXK;
- b) Pledge of allegiance led by Mike, N6AXQ;
- c) Self-introductions by all.

#### 2) Special program: Kristen McIntyre, K6WX, ARRL First Vice President:

- a) As an honored guest, Kristen gave a very informative and technically detailed presentation on Standing Wave Ratio (SWR), which is a topic of mystery or misunderstanding for many ham operators. Her presentation defined SWR in very understandable terms, gave examples of SWR characteristics, and its effect on station performance;
- b) Her presentation was followed by a question and answer session on the ARRL organization, current issues, and outlook for amateur radio in general.
- 3) **Reading of Minutes by Jack, W6JAK.** The minutes were approved as read upon a motion by Walt, K6WGY.
- 4) **Treasurer's Report** by Ken, AE6LA (see attached report):
  - a) Ken went over his most recent banking summary and the Umpqua Bank statement. Ken's banking summary matches the bank's statement;
  - b) The banking summary showed a beginning balance of \$5,289.30 and an ending balance of \$4,980.92. Expenses exceeded income by \$308.38; The major expense was \$300 for three-months rent at the Fowler site (Jan through March).

#### 5) Monday Night Net Report by Mark, N6IV:

- a) The average number of member of check-ins for the past two months was 34 with a range of 27 to 40;
- b) Guest check-ins averaged 6, with a range of 3 to 10.
- 6) **Repeater Report** presented by Ken, AE6LA:
  - a) Fowler Peak repeater: Ken saw Knox La Rue, the Fowler repeater site owner, who stated he will rework the antenna system. Ken has had to point is home yagi antenna at the site to improve the received signal.
  - b) Summit Level repeater: The noise problem at the site comes and goes. Ken and Mike, WA6ZTY, are planning on going to the site do some checks on the system. Cal Fire is in process of upgrading the site's solar power system.
  - c) Reba/Bear Valley repeater: Due to the snow level, the site is currently not

accessible. Ken is planning a trip to the site this spring to investigate the repeater sensitivity issue. The link radio will be used for the Death Ride event this coming July. Members interested in participating in communications support for the ride should contact Mike, WA6ZTY.

- 7) **Breakfast Report** presented by Al, KF6OBM. Ten people showed up for the ad-hoc breakfast at the Murphys Hotel. The breakfast was originally not scheduled due to the schedule change from monthly to bi-monthly on even months. A discussion ensued on changing it back to monthly breakfasts. Chuck, W6AJW, motioned the breakfasts schedule be changed back to a monthly basis. The motion was seconded and approved.
- 8) **Web Master's Report.** No report was given since Andy, NV6V, was not present at the meeting.
- 9) **Public Information Officer Report** presented by Mike, KB6USJ:
  - a) Mike described the calendar of upcoming events, including Winter Field Day, the VHF contests, potential Parks on the Air (POTA) event at Big Trees park, and a planned field trip to the historic KPH radio station;
  - b) The latest on the pico balloon project is that Dave, WB6TOU's balloon has drifted down to the southern hemisphere.

## 10) ARES/RACES Report.

- a) Jack, W6JAK, read the report provided by Sam, WS6P (see attached).
- b) Ken, AE6LA, stated that 10 years ago Calaveras Search and Rescue (SAR) sent a letter to the CARS president inviting hams to get involved in SAR. Hams still have opportunities to serve public agencies. For those interested in supporting SARS, they are having a meeting next Tuesday.
- 11) **New Business.** New business topics of POTA, the Death Ride, and the KPH field trip were previously discussed.

## 12) Old Business.

- a) Al, KF6OBM, installed new carpet and padding for the club trailer. He now plans on installing new lithium batteries;
- b) The update to the bylaws will be discussed at the next meeting.

## 13) Round Table:

- a) Old radios, including a Hallicrafters HT-9 radio donated my Mike, KB6USJ, is available for purchase. Proceeds will go to the club.
- b) Kirsten, K6WX, encouraged everyone to become members of the ARRL to ensure the future of amateur radio. A show of hands indicated most of those attending the meeting are current members.
